Classes developed:

Storyboard and Sequential Art - taught on the principles of storyboard creation and uasge for animation. Topics covered included cinematography, staging, acting within drawings and basic story/scene structure and deve opment. Additional teaching methods included film study, short story exercises, script analysis, in-class short board exercises from lecture material. Homework allowed students to create longer sequences. Outcome goals were to prepare animators for how to create their own boards and stories in animation and to prepare them for real-world industry opportunities as a board artist for animation.

Drawing for Animation - taught on the principles of story-telling through gesture drawing and the clothed model. Adapted Animation drawing theory to life drawing theory with a focus beyond replication of the model, but with an emphasis on problem-solving, emotion and expression.

Concept Development - taught on the principles of illustration as they are applied to the pre-production area of the entertainment industry. Introduced the principles of traditional painting into a digital painting language. Taught basic digital painting techniques for industry usage Focused on character design and environment design for the entertainment industry, and the basics of crafting a functional pitch package for entertainment.

Acting and Directing - taught on the principles of acting and directing as they are applied to the animation industry. Introduced the principles of basic stage acting and its similarities and differences to animation acting. Provided students with in-class improvisation exercises to apply lecture material. Discussions on how to draw and film reference acting for projects, as well as film study were included in weekly classes. Created assignments for intermediate 2D animation instruction in emotion and body mechanics.

Used my profession experience in crafting stories for Animated Feature and TV productions to shepherd the functional constuction of stories.

BFA Thesis + Exhibition - guided Senior Animation students in shaping her/his project and the production of all elements of the BFA thesis.

Image Narrative and Sequence - taught on the principles of sequential story-development with broad application to beat boards, picturebook illustration, graphic novels, film-making and music accompaniment.

Life Drawing for illustrators - taught on the principles of story-telling through gesture drawing and the clothed model. Adapted Animation drawing theory to life drawing theory with a focus beyond replication of the model, but with an emphasis on problem-solving, emotion and expression.

Picture Book Illustration - taught on the principles of illustration as they applied to the niche of Picture Book Illustration. Focus on character design, storyboarding, story-pacing, page composition and story design. Other topics covered included portfolio organization, business practices and production timetable and printing timetable of picture books.

All courses taught featured a 15-20 minute opening visual problem-solving exercise, a critique of the previous week's assignment, the current week's lecture and an in class exercise based on the current lecture. One on one student time and repoire were developed during exercise time. All courses were taught within a 3 hour time-slot over the course of 8 weeks. Students ranged from late high school and college level, to mid career artists and seniors. Teaching style features a focus on Audio, visual and kinesthetic learning methods to best communicate with each type of communication style.
